Mosquito Spraying

We have been notified by Anne Arundel County that Long Point's assigned mosquito fogging night is Thursday. Our community will only ever be fogged on Thursday nights during the 2021 season. Fogging can occur anytime between 7PM and 2:30AM. Please stay indoors while fogging operations are being conducted. The fog program began on May 26th and continues through October 5th. Residents who do not wish their property to be fogged may file an exemption.
